A large number of people visited the popular picnic resort, Jervis Bay, on Anniversary Day. The weather was exceptionally fine, and a very pleasant day was spent by all.

The St. Vincent Sailing Club held a successful sports carnival, the greatest attraction being the sailing race. The banks at the mouth of Currambene Creek were lined with people to witness this interesting event. About 2 pm the boats-*Leonie* (Scratch), *Lizzie* (20 secs), *Alexandra* (2 min. 10 secs), *Delmar* (3 min. 30 secs), *Phyllis* (5 min. 20 sec), and the *Wanderer* (7 min) left the wharf, proceeding to the starting point. A strong noreaster was blowing, making the sailing difficult but after as little delay the *Leonie*, *Lizzie, Delmar* and *Phyllis* got away together. The *Alexandra* losing a little time while the *Wanderer's* rudder broke, putting her out of the race. Mr Dent's launch followed the boats out round the second buoy, the *Leonie* then having a lead of 2 minutes, the other four boats being well together. Between the second and third buoys the *Leonie* slightly increased her lead from the *Delmar, Lizzie* and *Alexandra*, the *Phyllis* dropping behind. The second time round the *Leonie* made nearly a direct line between the first and second buoys, while the other boats tacked nearly over to the beach. The *Leonie* held the lead to the finish of the race, arriving 7 min 13 sec before the *Delmar*. With the handicaps the results were:-

Mr Lackersteen made the presentation, with a few appropriate terms. Mr Ellmoos returned thanks, and said that he would wear the watch as a trophy of true sport, for which the St. Vincent Sailing Club was famed. He wished the Club every success in the future, and promised to assist it all he possibly could.
